- 1 Or immediately following the conclusion of the Council Special Session meeting.
- Mayor Williams called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. and called roll with the following members present, Mayor Rhonda Williams, Christina Porath, Keith Chitwood, Amber Wood, Gerald Young and Kevin Bell.
- 2. City Secretary Edie Sims offered the prayer and lead the Pledge of Allegiance to the American and Texas Flags.
- Mayor Williams read a proclamation for National Drinking Water Week May 5 11, 2019.
 Kevin Bell asked if residents could receive bottled water at City Hall during this week when they come in to pay their bill. Council concurred to stand behind our Proclamation.
- 4. Consent Agenda: a) Discuss, approve or disapprove the minutes from Special Session held on March 5, 2019; Regular Session held on March 5, 2019; and two Special Session meetings held on March 19, 2019; b) Public Works Update; c) City Financial Report; d) Fire Department Report; e) Animal Control Report; and f) Collin County Calls for Service

Amber Wood motioned to approve items the Consent Agenda with Christina Porath seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Second Public Hearing to receive public comments, discuss and act upon a request to replat a Final Plat known as Williams Place, an addition located at 10636 County Road 497, Princeton, TX, also known as Abstract A0116, J. Burk Survey, Tract 29, containing 7.439 acres, replatting into 2 lots and also which is located within the City of Blue Ridge's Extra Territorial Jurisdiction

Mayor Williams opened the Public Hearing at 7:08pm asking those FOR the replat request to come forward. Adrian McDaniel stated he is for the replat as he is selling 2 acres to his daughter and her husband. With no one else coming forward, Mayor Williams asked those OPPOSING the replat to come forward. With no one coming forward, Mayor Williams closed the Public Hearing at 7:08pm.

Kevin Bell motioned to approve the replat as presented with Keith Chitwood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

6. Receive update on the Ridgeway Drive Roadway and Water Replacement Project including a contract with Henley Johnston & Associates for construction materials testing

Craig Kerkhoff, engineer for the project, stated the project is moving along well. The water line has been just about completely installed to date and will be testing the water before final connections for the residents. The contract with Henley Johnston & Associates is to ensure all subgrades meet specifications along with the backfill of the water line. The roadway will be the last portion of the project.

7. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon a Change Order for the Ridgeway project regarding installation of an additional gate valve and transferring water service</u>

Craig Kerkhoff stated the Public Works realized a need for an additional valve during the construction which resulted in the Change Order submitted. The additional valve will increase the contract by \$2,628.00. Amber Wood motioned to approve the Change Order as presented with Gerald Young seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

8. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon a contract with Birkhoff, Hendricks & Carter, LLP to provide engineering services for a water and wastewater impact fee analysis</u>

Craig Kerkhoff's firm proposed the agreement to perform an impact fee analysis for water and wastewater. This is another level to prepare for growth and how infrastructure will be paid for by those impacting our existing system. City Secretary Edie Sims stated at another City, the impact fee study was upwards of \$25,000. The fee proposed is not the same style and as a comparative note, the fee is much less. Mr. Kerkhoff added these services are not allowed to be bid out, but the statement regarding cost is a comparison only.

Gerald Young motioned to approve the contract as presented with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

9. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon Ordinance O-2019-0402-002 prohibiting certain commercial vehicles in residential districts and allowing for a truck route</u>

The ordinance presented is to restrict delivery trucks from using Ridgeway as their thoroughfare. The City is working with TxDOT regarding signage and an approved truck route. We will have a Municipal Maintenance Agreement with TxDOT at a future meeting.

Kevin Bell motioned to approve the Ordinance as presented with Keith Chitwood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

10. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon tax exemptions for residential property with owners 65 years of age and older</u>

Gerald Young had requested this item at the last meeting. City Secretary Edie Sims presented 3 ordinances (6-4-91; 96-1119; and 98-0106) which are the only ordinances on file regarding tax exemptions for disabled or residents 65 and older.

Council further discussed how the tax rate was increased to afford the needs of the City and how raising the tax exemption amount would affect the City's ability of providing services in the future. Council concurred to take no action.

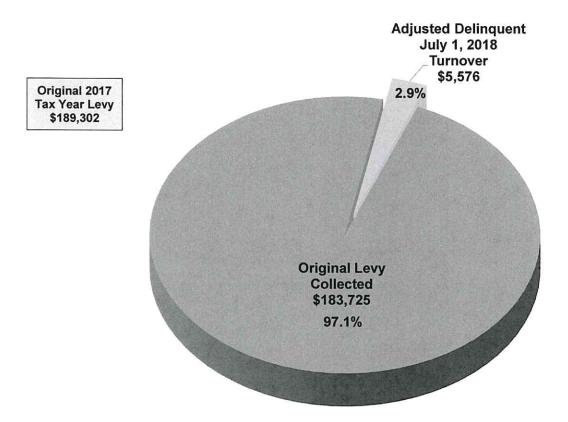

CITY OF BLUE RIDGE 2017 Tax Year Analysis

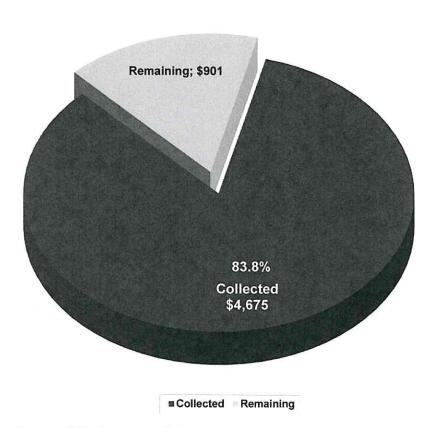

LEASE AGREEMENT WITH 903 BROADBAND

This Lease Agreement is made the 7th day of May, 2019, between City of Blue Ridge 200 S Main St, Blue Ridge, TX 75424 hereafter referred to as LESSOR, and 903 Broadband, Inc 4360 CR 411 McKinney, TX 75071 hereafter referred to as LESSEE.

Statement of Background Information and General Intent

LESSOR owns one or more towers used primarily for Water, but which can also be leased for additional income to LESSEE to be used as a pedestal for telecommunication transmission equipment without interfering with the primary purpose of Water.

LESSEE is an Internet provider company which desires to provide high speed wireless Internet services to customers who will benefit Lessor, its customers and the surrounding community. LESSEE desires to lease and to use the tower as more particularly described in Exhibit "A" as a pedestal for telecommunication transmission equipment (hereafter referred to as "equipment") with the needed access and rights to install, operate and to protect its equipment without interference, which will save LESSEE the capital cost of building its own tower or paying higher rentals to a national tower company. LESSOR recognizes that the number of customers at first will be limited in number and that the economics do not support and justify the higher monthly rentals paid by wireless telephone carriers.

LESSOR and LESSEE agree that LESSEE shall have the right to install, operate, maintain and repair its equipment on the tower and premises with twenty-four (24) hour access and the duty not to interfere with LESSOR'S primary use of the tower; that LESSOR shall have the right to operate, maintain and repair the tower with 24 hour access and the duty not to interfere with LESSEE'S use of the tower as a transmission pedestal and that LESSOR and LESSEE shall each have the mutual responsibilities to the other to cooperate with each other so that the mutual goals of each may be accomplished to the mutual benefit of each.

Terms and Conditions

Now, therefore, for good and valuable consideration and the mutual benefit to each, **LESSOR** and **LESSEE** promise and agree to lease the following described tower upon the following described terms and conditions:

- 1. <u>Leased Premises</u>. The tower and its location and the portion of the tower consisting of space on the side and/or top of the tower together with a small ground space close to the tower for ground equipment and cable connecting the equipment on top of the tower to the ground equipment and electrical access (hereafter referred to as "Premises") is described in Exhibit A.
- 2. Equipment. The equipment permitted and covered by this lease is described in Exhibit B.
- 3. <u>Length of Lease</u>. This lease shall be for a term of five (5) years beginning upon date of execution of this lease agreement. This lease shall renew for a period of three (3), five (5) year terms unless either LESSEE or LESSOR contract in writing sixty (60) days prior to renewal.
- 4. Rent. LESSEE shall pay LESSOR \$250 monthly. The rent shall increase each year of the term by three (3) percent. LESSEE shall also provide LESSOR two high speed internet accounts at LESSEE's current gold service plan. That is 20mbps down and 4 mbps up with no data cap. LESSEE shall also provide LESSOR phone service at city hall with the current setup that is being used at the time of this contract. Any upgrades or extra phones are to be reviewed and decided on when they are needed. LESSEE and LESSOR shall also review this agreement on a yearly basis to determine if any changes here are needed. If changes are needed, and have been agreed on this agreement shall be amended as such.
- 5. Access by LESSEE and LESSOR. LESSEE shall have twenty-four-hour access to the Premises in order to install, operate, maintain and remove its equipment provided that LESSEE shall not interfere with the primary purpose of tower. The field representatives of LESSOR and LESSEE shall work together to provide access and to insure security and shall notify the other of activities which may affect the other.
- 6. <u>Utilities</u> It is specifically understood and agreed that power consumption of lessee is nominal and is included in the monthly rental amount.

- 7. Maintenance and Responsibility for Communications Equipment. LESSEE shall provide proper maintenance and shall be responsible for all costs for the installation of the equipment or any appurtenances and shall reimburse LESSOR for any cost incurred by LESSOR in the maintenance of the structure due to the placement or removal of the equipment. LESSEE shall comply with federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations in its operations and maintenance. LESSEE shall not cause debris or anything of a dangerous, noxious, or offensive nature upon the premises or interfere with the primary purpose of HAM radio.
- 8. <u>Disruptions and Avoidance of Disruptions</u>. LESSEE understands that it may become necessary for LESSOR to repair, maintain, or paint the tower during the term of the lease and LESSOR understands that disruptions to LESSEE must be avoided if reasonably possible and must be minimized if disruptions cannot be avoided. Therefore, if reasonably possible, LESSOR shall repair, maintain, or paint the tower without causing disruption, but in the event that LESSOR'S repair, maintenance or painting operations of the tower necessarily require the temporary disruption of LESSEE'S transmissions, LESSOR shall have the right to do so, but LESSOR shall do so in a manner to minimize the disruption. Further, if the tower requires repair, maintenance or painting which cannot be done without disruption, LESSOR will bid the repair, maintenance or painting with two options: repairing, maintaining or painting with communication equipment in place and LESSEE shall have the right to avoid disruption by paying the difference or the duty to cover or remove its equipment during the repairing, maintaining or painting operations. As further incentive to avoid and minimize disruptions, LESSEE shall not be required to pay the pro rata rental during the period of disruption itself and for the additional period of three times the period of disruption. LESSOR shall give at least thirty (30) days advance notice of such repair, maintenance or painting activities, provided that in case of an emergency, notification is not required, but LESSEE shall be notified as soon as reasonably possible.
- 9. Taxes. LESSEE shall be solely responsible for any taxes on its equipment and personal property.
- 10. <u>Assumption of Risk and Indemnification by LESSEE</u>. LESSEE undertakes and assumes for its officers, agents, affiliates, contractors, subcontractors and employees all risks of dangerous conditions, if any, on or about the Premises and LESSEE hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless LESSOR against and from any claim asserted or liability imposed upon the LESSOR for personal injury or property damage to any person arising out of LESSEE'S installation, operation, maintenance, removal or use of the Premises or LESSEE'S communications equipment or LESSEE'S failure to comply with any federal, state or local laws, ordinances or regulations.
- 11. <u>Insurance</u>. During the term of the lease, **LESSEE** shall maintain in full force and effect at its sole cost and expense worker's compensation insurance as required by law and comprehensive commercial general liability insurance with minimum limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.) as the combined single limit for each occurrence of bodily injury, personal injury, death and property damage. Proof of the required insurance shall be furnished to **LESSOR** and the **LESSEE** shall notify its insurance carrier in writing that **LESSOR** is to be named an additional insured and direct the insurance carrier to notify **LESSOR** at least 20 days prior to cancellation of the policy. A copy of **LESSEE'S** notification shall be sent to **LESSOR**.

12. Grounds of Termination.

LESSOR shall have the right to terminate this lease if:

- a. LESSOR is prohibited by any governmental entity from continued use of the Premises during the term of the lease or the LESSOR'S right to control or occupy the Premises is terminated due to causes beyond its control.
- Nonpayment of rentals or breach of other conditions and provisions of lease by LESSEE or bankruptcy by LESSEE.

LESSEE shall have the right to terminate this lease if:

- a. LESSEE is prohibited by any governmental entity from continued use of the Premises during the term of the lease or the LESSEE'S right to control or occupy the Premises is terminated due to causes beyond its control.
- Breach of other conditions and provisions of lease by LESSOR.
- 13. Removal. The LESSEE shall have both the duty and the right to remove its equipment from the premises upon termination of the lease. Such removal shall be done in a workmanlike and careful manner and without interference or damage to any other equipment, structures or operations on the Premises. If LESSEE requests permission not to remove all or a portion of the

improvements and LESSOR consents to such non-removal, title to the affected improvements shall thereupon transfer to LESSOR and the same thereafter shall be the sole and entire property of LESSOR, and LESSEE shall be relieved of its duty to otherwise remove the same.

Upon removal of the improvements (or portions thereof) as provided above, LESSEE shall restore the affected area of the tower and Premises and shall be responsible for all costs and expenses for the removal and restoration.

- 14. Assignment and Non-Exclusive. LESSEE may assign this lease agreement upon notice to and approval of LESSOR which shall not be unreasonably withheld. LESSOR reserves the right to enter into lease agreements with other parties provided that the transmission of any subsequent lessees shall not interfere with the transmission of LESSEE and shall not be inconsistent with the rights of LESSEE under the lease agreement.
- 15. Notices. All notices, requests, demands, and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed given if personally delivered or mailed, certified mail, return receipt requested, to the following addresses:

- 16. Special Conditions and Provisions, If Any:
 - It is specifically understood and agreed that Lessee will be using the 2.4 Ghz, 3.65 Ghz, and 5Ghz to 6Ghz license free spectrum for which it is possible that there may be interference if another 2.4 Ghz, 3.65 Ghz, and 5Ghz to 6Ghz license free spectrum user transmits from the same tower; and, therefore, the tower covered by this lease shall not be leased for another 2.4 Ghz, 3.65 Ghz, and 5 Ghz to 6Ghz license free spectrum user during the term of this lease. This also includes the 900 Mhz range.

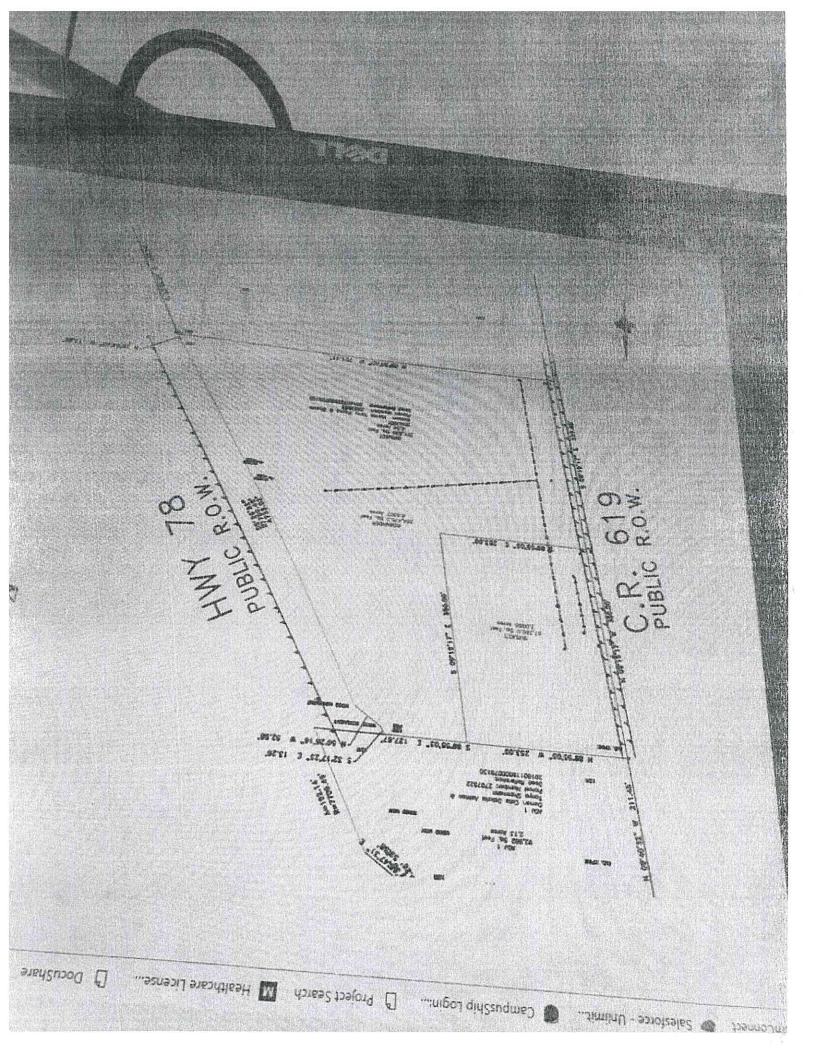

CITY OF BLUE RIDGE

SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS PRESCRIBING RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PLATS, PLANS AND SUBDIVISION OF LAND WITHIN THE INCORPORATED AREA AND EXTRA-TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS, HEREIN DEFINED AS THE "CITY"; CONTAINING CERTAIN DEFINITIONS: PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS FOR STREETS, SIDE-WALKS, ALLEYS, SANITARY UTILITIES, WATER MAINS, STORM SEWERS, AND OTHER DRAINANGE STRUCTURES AND COMMUNITY FACILITIES;

PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) FOR EACH VIOLATION THEREOF, PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONSTITUTION AND THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, INCLUDING PARTICULARLY CHAPTERS 231, ACTS OF THE 40TH LEGISLATURE, REGULAR SESSION, 1927, AS HERETOFORE OR HEREAFTER AMENDED (COMPILED AS ARTICLES 974a AND 6626, V.A.C.S.), AND THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 4 OF THE MUNICIPAL ANNEXATION ACT (COMPILED AS ARTICLE 970a), AS HERETOFORE OR HEREAFTER AMENDED, THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE IE EMPOWERED TO REGULATE THE SUBDIVISION OF PROPERTY INSIDE ITS CORPORATE LIMITS AND EXTRA-TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION; AND

WHEREAS, THE REGULATION OF SUBDIVISIONS IS DEEMED TO BE NECESSARY TO PROVIDE FOR THE ORDERLY, SAFE AND HEALTHFUL DEVELOPMENT OF THE AREA WITHIN THE CITY AND ITS EXTRA-TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION AND TO PROMOTE THE HEALTH, SAFETY, MORALS AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS:

ON AND AFTER THE PASSAGE OF THIS ORDINANCE, ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION SEEKING APPROVAL OF ANY PLAT, PLAN, REPLAT OR ANY SUBDIVISION OF LAND WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS AND ITS LEGALLY ESTABLISHED EXTRA-TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION, SHALL BE REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ORDINANCE BEFORE SUCH APPROVAL MAY BE GRANTED, TO WIT:

SECTION 1. - GENERAL

THESE REGULATIONS SHALL GOVERN EVERY PERSON, FIRM, ASSOCIATION, OR CORPORATION OWNING ANY TRACT OF LAND WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OR THE EXTRA-TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS, WHO MAY HEREAFTER DIVIDE THE SAME INTO TWO OR MORE PARTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF LAYING OUTANY SUBDIVISION OF ANY TRACT OF LAND OR ANY ADDITION TO SAID CITY, OR FOR LAYING OUT ANY SURBURBAN LOTS OR BUILIDNG LOTS, OR ANY LOTS, STREETS, ALLEYS, PARKS OR OTHER PORTIONS INTENDED FOR PUBLIC USE OR THE USE OF PURCHASERS OF LOTS FRONTING THEREON OR ADJACENT THERETO;
