THE BLUE RIDGE CITY COUNCIL MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT 7:00 P.M. ON TUESDAY, MAY 5, 2019 AT THE BLUE RIDGE COMMUNITY CENTER, LOCATED AT 200 W. TILTON, BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS 75424 AT 7:00 P.M. WITH THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ON THE AGENDA FOR CONSIDERATION AND/OR ACTION.

- Mayor Williams called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and called roll with the following members present, Mayor Rhonda Williams, Christina Porath, Keith Chitwood, Amber Wood, and Allen Cunnyngham.
- 2. City Secretary Edie Sims offered the prayer and lead the Pledge of Allegiance to the American and Texas Flags.
- 3. <u>Announcements relating to items of public interest: The Blue Ridge ISD will be holding a Class of 2020 Senior Parade on May 9, 2020 at noon; Proclamation proclaiming the month of June 2020 as Men's Health Month</u>

Mayor Williams announced the Class of 2020 Senior Parade and read the Proclamation regarding Men's Health Month.

### 4. Public Comment

No one signed up or spoke at this time.

5. Consent Agenda: a) Discuss, approve or disapprove the minutes from Session held March 3, 2020, Regular Session held March 3, 2020, and Emergency Session held March 31, 2020; b) Public Works Update; c) City Financial Report; d) Fire Department Report; and e) Animal Control Report

Christina Porath motioned to approve the Consent Agenda as presented with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

6. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon a Special Event Application to close the square on May 9, 2020 from 11am to 1:30pm for the Blue Ridge ISD Class of 2020 Senior Parade</u>

Tonya Harrison spoke for the parents of the Seniors who are putting together the parade and requested the square be closed, if the City would close Ridgeway and East Lamm and if the fee would be waived. The School Resource Officer will be working closely with Collin County Sheriff's Office to have the major roadways blocked.

Christina Porath motioned to approve the square closure with the City blocking the requested streets and that the fee be waived. Amber Wood seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

7. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon Resolution 2020-0505-001 denying Texas New Mexico Power Company's application for a distribution cost recovery factor increase within the City of Blue Ridge</u>

Amber Wood motioned to approve the Resolution as presented with Christina Porath seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

8. Consider, discuss and act upon purchasing a vehicle for the Public Works Director

Public Works Director Brad Meserole came before the Council expressing the issues with his current vehicle, of which the wiring harness will need replacing which is very costly,

transmission is out, the front end needs rebuilding and the vehicle is a 2007. It was purchased used and since we have attained the vehicle, it has approximately 120,000 miles. Mr. Meserole was not clear what the mileage was when the vehicle was purchased from the City of Little Elm.

City Secretary Edie Sims stated since the City did not hold an election, we have \$6,925 which would be transferred from the Elections line item to use as a down payment for a vehicle and finance the remainder.

Council reviewed the different opportunities provided for a Chevrolet and Ford. The Chevrolet thru Ray Huffines has the least price and best options for the City. The General Manager for this dealership also lives in Blue Ridge, so the keeping local is still prevailing.

Christina Porath motioned to approve an ordinance moving funds from the Elections line item of the budget to Vehicle Purchase and purchasing a vehicle with financing thru Ray Huffines Chevrolet. Amber Wood seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

9. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon insurance and financing issues with Well #3 behind post office</u> and the issues and maintenance for the well

Public Works Director Brad Meserole stated to the Council an issue occurred with Well #3 when he noticed production was dropping from 220 to 160 gallons per minute. After an investigation, Mr. Meserole contacted CCS Water Specialists to make repairs. CCS found holes in the stem and the motor aged out. The last time this motor was touched was approximately 12 years ago. The motor was replaced with a larger motor and the only item left undone is the screen cleaning. This will need to be done later and CCS will not re-charge for entering the well, only the labor for the cleaning.

The estimate for the repairs has been submitted to our insurance and we are awaiting their response. The estimate is for \$57,432.76. Council concurred to wait for the response from our insurance before going forward. No further action at this time.

10. Consider, discuss and act upon a Service Agreement with MVA Services for ongoing maintenance of electrical/instrumentation and mechanical repair with replacement of all pumps, valves, motors, controls, switchgears and all instruments pertaining to our water and wastewater operations

MVA is the same provider who has recently rescued the City's wastewater issues. The Service Agreement is recommended for ongoing maintenance. The key to longevity of our equipment is ongoing maintenance. Christina Porath motioned to approve the Service Agreement as presented with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

11. Consider, discuss and act upon a Service Agreement with Streamline Systems for the two heat/air conditioning units at City Hall

The Streamline Systems services are less expensive than the current provider. Christina Porath motioned to approve the service agreement as presented with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

12. Consider, discuss and act upon the resignation of RexAnne Braswell as Court Clerk

Judge Terry Douglas investigated and confirmed he is allowed to serve as both Judge and Court Clerk which will save us \$2,400 per year. He will continue to serve as both for \$200 per month.

Christina Porath motioned to accept the resignation with Amber Wood seconding the motion.

13. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon extending the declaration of local state of disaster due to public health emergency and how to re-open the City of Blue Ridge and other matters related to the COVID-19 Pandemic</u>

Council discussed all aspects of opening City Hall and the pros/cons and staying within the CDC guidelines as well as the orders per Governor Abbott. During the required closing of City Hall to the public, our customers made their payments either online, by phone using their credit/debit card, or utilized the drop box at City Hall. No change has been made when customers pay with cash. Any overages are accounted to their bill and reflected as a credit.

Christina Porath motioned to open City Hall with the following stipulations: all customers must wear face covering; only one (1) customer at a time; public restrooms will not be accessible. Further discussion was had regarding employees and all attempts to keep employees safe. Amber Wood motioned add to the above motion by Christina Porath adding all employees are to return to full time work effective May 6, 2020. Keith Chitwood seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Council Reconvened into Open Session at 8:21pm with no action being taken.

17. <u>Adjournment.</u> Christina Porath motioned to adjourn with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Council adjourned at 8:22pm.



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS TO DISANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY FROM THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TO WIT: 15.5810 ACRES OF LAND IN THE M MOWERY SURVEY, ABSTRACT A0557, SHEET 2, TRACT 139; AND 24.8159 ACRES OF LAND IN THE NATHAN MITCHELL SURVEY, ABSTRACT A0639, TRACT 3 WHICH WAS ANNEXED PURUSANT TO ORDINANCE #1042000 DATED JANUARY 4, 2000; TO AMEND THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY TO COMPLY WITH THE SAID DISANNEXATION; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY SECRETARY TO TAKE ALL APPROPRIATE AND NECESSARY ACTION TO TERMINATE ANY AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGEAND THE OWNERS OF THE PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF BLUE RIDGE, INC DESCRIBED AS PROPERTY ID 1063912 AND PROPERTY ID 1044186; AND TO IMPLEMENT THIS ORDINANCE IMMEDIATELY UPON ITS ADOPTION; PROVIDING FOR REPEALING, SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; FINDING THAT ALL NECESSARY AND REQUIRED LEGAL CONDITIONS HAVE BEEN SATISFIED; FINDING PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on January 4, 2000 pursuant to Ordinance No. 1042000, two tracts of land was annexed into the City of Blue Ridge, Texas (the "City"), to wit: Abstract A0557 M Mowery Survey, Sheet 2, Tract 139 containing 15.581 acres, Property ID 1063912; and Abstract A0639 Nathan Mitchell Survey, Tract 3 containing 24.8159 acres, Property ID 1044186; as depicted in Exhibit "A" (map), attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, Section 43.144 of the Texas Local Government Code allows a General-Law municipality in a sparsely populated area to discontinue an areas as part of the municipality if the area consists of at least 10 acres contiguous to the municipality; and the area is uninhabited; or contains fewer than one occupied residence or business structure for every two acres and fewer than three occupied residences or business structures on any one acre. The disannexation is accomplished by adopting an Ordinance with the Mayor entering in the minutes or records an order discontinuing the area. Then the area ceases to be a part of the municipality on the date of the entry of the order; and

WHEREAS, the City has investigated and determined Property ID 1063912 and Property ID 1044186 qualifies for disannexation under Section 43.144 of the Texas Local Government Code, and the laws of this state have been duly followed with respect to said area; and

WHEREAS, a request from the property owner has been received to disannex from the incorporated limits of the City of Blue Ridge.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The aforementioned area is hereby disannexed from the City of Blue Ridge, Collin County, Texas, and they are no longer a part thereof.

SECTION 2. The inhabitants of the area which is hereby disannexed shall hereinafter not be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of other citizens of the City of Blue Ridge and they shall not be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions and regulations of the City, except to the extent they may have been so bound prior to the annexation that took effect January 4, 2000 pursuant to Ordinance No. 1042000. The Service Plan adopted by Ordinance No. 1042000 shall have no effect in or applicability to the area hereby disannexed.

SECTION 3. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to take all appropriate and necessary action to notify and report the disannexation to other authorities.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. The City hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 6. The corporate limits of the City are hereby amended to comply with the disannexation described in this Ordinance. The official map and boundaries of the City are hereby amended and revised so as to exclude the are hereby disannexed.

SECTION 7. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to implement this Ordinance immediately upon its adoption and take any property and necessary steps to effectuate its intent and purposes and to amend the official City maps to reflect the changes made by this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. The City Secretary is hereby directed to file with the County Clerk of Collin County, Texas, a certified copy of this Ordinance, and is hereby instructed to include this Ordinance in the records of the City.

SECTION 9. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was introduced and passed was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of the meeting was given as required by law.

SECTION 10. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

#### Hello Edie:

The only way a general law city can disannex is in accordance with the Local Government Code:

Sec. 43.143. DISANNEXATION BY PETITION AND ELECTION IN GENERAL-LAW MUNICIPALITY. (a) When at least 50 qualified voters of an area located in a general-law municipality sign and present a petition to the mayor of the municipality that describes the area by metes and bounds and requests that the area be declared no longer part of the municipality, the mayor shall order an election on the question in the municipality. The election shall be held on the first uniform election date prescribed by Chapter 41, Election Code, that occurs after the date on which the petition is filed and that affords enough time to hold the election in the manner required by law.

- (b) When a majority of the votes received in the election favor discontinuing the area as part of the municipality, the mayor shall declare that the area is no longer a part of the municipality and shall enter an order to that effect in the minutes or records of the governing body of the municipality. The area ceases to be a part of the municipality on the date of the order. However, the area may not be discontinued as part of the municipality if the discontinuation would result in the municipality having less area than one square mile or one mile in diameter around the center of the original municipal boundaries.
- (c) If the area withdraws from a municipality as provided by this section and if, at the time of the withdrawal, the municipality owes any debts, by bond or otherwise, the area is not released from its pro rata share of that indebtedness. The governing body shall continue to levy a property tax each year on the property in the area at the same rate that is levied on other property in the municipality until the taxes collected from the area equal its pro rata share of the indebtedness. Those taxes may be charged only with the cost of levying and collecting the taxes, and the taxes shall be applied exclusively to the payment of the pro rata share of the indebtedness. This subsection does not prevent the

inhabitants of the area from paying in full at any time their pro rata share of the indebtedness.

Acts 1987, 70th Leg., ch. 149, Sec. 1, eff. Sept. 1, 1987.

- Sec. 43.144. DISANNEXATION OF SPARSELY POPULATED AREA IN GENERAL-LAW MUNICIPALITY. (a) The mayor and governing body of a general-law municipality by ordinance may discontinue an area as a part of the municipality if:
- (1) the area consists of at least 10 acres contiguous to the municipality; and
  - (2) the area:
    - (A) is uninhabited; or
- (B) contains fewer than one occupied residence or business structure for every two acres and fewer than three occupied residences or business structures on any one acre.
- (b) On adoption of the ordinance, the mayor shall enter in the minutes or records of the governing body an order discontinuing the area. The area ceases to be a part of the municipality on the date of the entry of the order.



transfer or assign any assets, debts or liabilities from Frognot Water Supply Corporation to Frognot Special Utility District as appropriate. M/C







AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020 IN ACCORDANCE WITH EXISTING STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS APPROPRIATING THE VARIOUS AMOUNTS HEREIN; REPEALING ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES AND ACTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Blue Ridge, Texas is a Type A General-Law Municipality located in Collin County, created in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Texas Local Government Code, and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas;

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Blue Ridge has reviewed the budget and which budget was adopted by the City Council for the Fiscal Year 2019-2020; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has determined the effects of the budget amendment will be in the best interest used for a transfer from the General Tax Fund Account Capital Outlay to the General Tax Fund Account Vehicle Purchase to accommodate an unfunded expense to pay off the purchased Public Works Vehicle, as shown by Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Blue Ridge believes the budget requires certain amendments and has submitted to the City Council proposed amendment(s) to the budget of the revenues and expenditures of conducting the affairs of said City as submitted by the Mayor.

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS;

#### SECTION 1. BUDGET AMENDMENT ADOPTION

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the amendments to the budget of the revenues and expenditures for the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 that are attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference are hereby adopted and the budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 is hereby accordingly so amended and the amended budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 adopted.

#### SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation of this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

#### SECTION 3: REPEALER CLAUSE

Any provision of any prior ordinance of the City, whether codified or uncodified, which is in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance, is hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict, but all other provisions of the ordinances of the City, whether codified or uncodified, which are not in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

#### SECTION 4: ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT

The City Secretary of the City of Blue Ridge is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Blue Ridge and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

#### SECTION 5: SAVINGS

All rights and remedies of the City of Blue Ridge are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

#### SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.





I started to work on developing a grant writing estimate for the National Park Service 2020 Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program and had to stop because of the following requirement (which Blue Ridge does not meet):

 Are located within or serve jurisdictions of 50,000 people or more and designated as "Urbanized Areas" by the Census Bureau from the 2010 Census;

This link is a map of the Urbanized Area for the Dallas-Fort Worth area. See the very bold/thick line drawn around the metro area – areas inside this thick line are considered designated as an urbanized area. Blue Ridge is outside this space.

However, there are definitely some opportunities for you with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). I have from my notes of when I was on site with you the following about the possible park site:

- Sewer Plant is on the end of Scott Road
- All land to the northwest of treatment and subdivision was donated by the developer of the homes near this land
- There is about 32.5 acres in this plot it is all in the floodplain
- Brad and Edie have talked extensively have a mini-lake where there can be fishing and kayaking just enough
  for small personal enjoyment; Edie would like an Amphitheatre where there can be community gatherings and
  concerts; picnic areas, trails, parking, restrooms, etc.

Here are the TPWD deadlines for grants they issue almost every year. I was going to wait a little longer in the summer to notify you because there is time but the Local Parks Non-Urban Outdoor Recreation would be a good one (due December 4) or Local Parks Small Community Recreation (due December 4). I'll go ahead and prepare some information and quotes for these two programs and then we can see where the pros and cons are for Blue Ridge. I'll be back in touch with these two park programs shortly.
